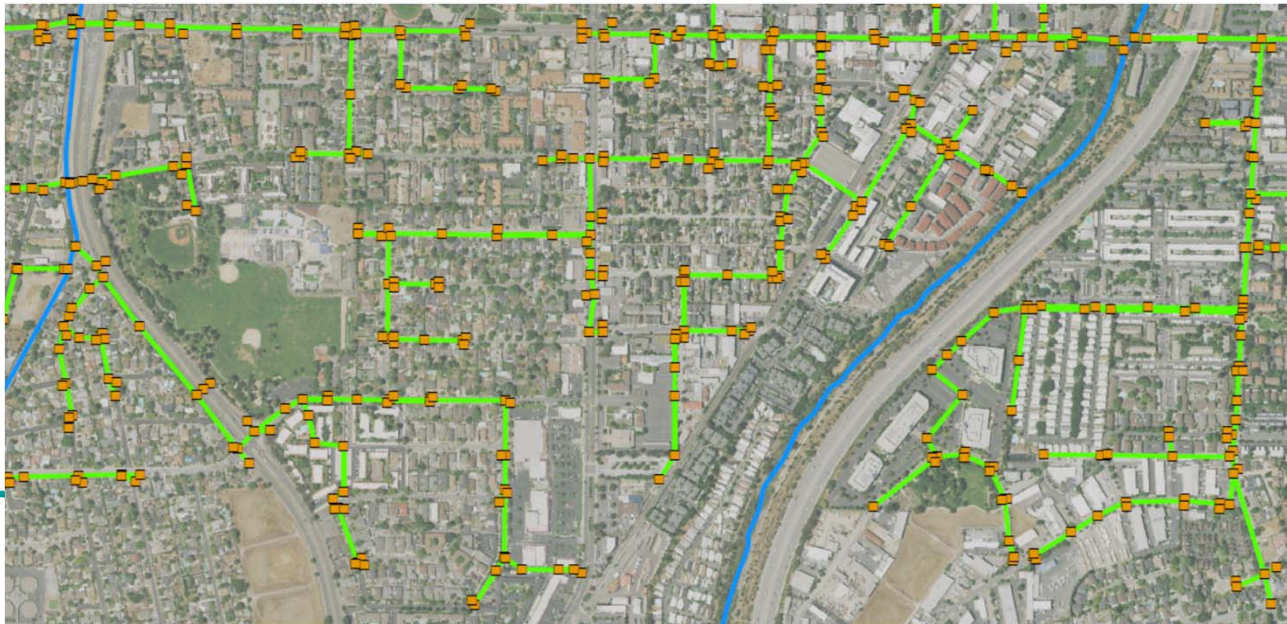
Spill Response and Notification Procedures

- Know your Agency specific procedures
- General Procedures
 - Have spill kits readily available
 - Notify key spill response personnel immediately
 - If materials is unknown or hazardous additional agency/department/staff may need to be contacted
 - If safe – contain material and block nearby storm drains

- If water is used it must be contained, collected and properly disposed

- no wash water can enter the storm drain

Spill Response and Notification Procedures

- General Procedures
 - Properly dispose of clean up material
 - Notifications – in addition to your agency point of contact, other notifications may be required
 - Valley Water (spill enters creek)
 - CalOES (reportable discharges)
 - Regional Water Board
