I. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE CALL TO ORDER / INTRODUCTIONS

John Bourgeois (Chair, Valley Water) called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. Management Committee (MC) members and other attendees introduced themselves.

II. ADDITIONS OR REVISIONS TO THE AGENDA; ANNOUNCEMENTS

Pam Boyle Rodriguez (Palo Alto) requested adding an agenda item to discuss the requirement to develop a plan and schedule for updating each Permittee's municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) information. The MC agreed to discuss it under *Agenda item VII.A.2 FY 2025-26 Annual Report Guidance*.

The following announcements were made:

- Chris Sommers (Program staff) informed the MC that the Santa Clara County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) is initiating a review of water and wastewater services that may include a review of stormwater services. The previous review, conducted in 2011, did not include stormwater services. Vanessa Marcadejas (County) added that scope is being determined and a kickoff meeting will be held on June 4, 2026.
- Imtiaz Ali (Water Board staff) is no longer working at the Water Board (WB). Jacob Fine-Thomas is the new WB staff covering Provisions C.10 and C.17.
- A celebration of life for Trish Mulvey (CLEAN South Bay) will be held on June 7, 2026.
- The 2026 Coastal & Estuarine Summit will be held in San Francisco from September 22 – 25, 2026. Chris will participate on a panel on regional water quality monitoring.
- Rajani Nair (San José) reported that the City of San José received the audit report from EPA staff. The report is generally positive, with a few items identified regarding the City's corporation yard maintenance program.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion: Ursula Syrova (Cupertino) moved to approve the minutes of the April 16, 2026 MC meeting. **Second:** Rajani Nair (San José). **Vote.** Motion passed unanimously.

IV. REVIEW OF ACTION ITEMS FROM LAST MEETING

Action Items from the April 16, 2026 MC meeting:

- Action item 4-26-1 (Schedule a meeting for the Cost Reporting Work Group in June) is to be done.
- Action item 4-26-2 (Invite Ashraf Ali (WB staff) to a future MC meeting.) is to be done. Ashraf will be invited to the June MC meeting.
- Action item 4-26-3 (Compile the comments received on individual Co-permittee Annual Reports for MC information.) is to be done.

Action Items from previous MC meetings and the November and December 2025 Budget AHTG meetings:

- Action item 1-26-1 (Invite Melissa Foley (SFEI) to the MC to present information on the Healthy Watersheds and Thriving Cities project.) is in progress. Program staff will contact Melissa to present information at the June MC meeting.
- Action item 2-26-2 (Research how agencies are addressing sanitary waste discharges from RVs and bring a recommendation to the MC regarding implementing a pilot mobile pump-out services program.) is complete. Program staff distributed two memoranda to the MC on April 22, 2026. One memorandum describes the research findings and the other has recommendations for implementing a pilot program. Program staff received minor corrections on the research memorandum from the City of Mountain View, and these have been addressed. Pam Boyle Rodriguez recommended scheduling a separate MC meeting to discuss the memos and potential next steps
- Action item 12-25-1 (Share information from CASQA on its dues analysis and budget development.) is in progress. Karen Cowan (Executive Director, CASQA) will be invited to make a presentation at a future MC meeting.
- Action item 12-25-2 (Contact SFEI staff to set up a date for a presentation on the RMP to the MC and the Monitoring AHTG.) is in progress. The presentation will be scheduled in summer 2026.
- Action item 12-25-3 (Provide additional detail on the anticipated scope of the ROWD submittal once this submittal is discussed with Water Board staff.) is in progress. This item will be completed after discussion with Water Board staff.
- Action item 12-25-4 (Set up a special MC (and/or C3PO AHTG) meeting to discuss priorities for FY 2025-26 GSI Work Plan tasks.) is done. The GSI Work Plan was discussed at the May C3PO AHTG meeting.
- Action item 12-25-5 (Arrange for San José staff to present information on the Sharks outreach campaign at a MC and/or WEO AHTG meeting.) is complete. San José staff will be presenting the information at today's meeting.
- Action item 2-25-6 (Discuss the implementation of BMPs for discharges associated with unsheltered homeless populations with other countywide program managers at a future BAMSC Steering Committee meeting) is in progress and will be brought up at a future Steering Committee meeting.

Action: Program staff will schedule a meeting to discuss the recommendations in the RV pump out services program memorandum.

V. TIME OPEN FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON ANY SUBJECT NOT ON AGENDA

No comments were provided.

VI. WATER BOARD STAFF COMMENTS

WB staff did not attend the meeting and no comments were submitted.

VII. PROGRAM BUSINESS

A. PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

1. Special Presentation: City of San Jose's advertising campaign with the Sharks Sports Team

Ivan Gutierrez (San José) presented information on the City of San Jose's anti-litter campaign with the Sharks Sports Team. Advertising was conducted in March 2026, with advertisements placed across multiple platforms including Facebook, Instagram, Google, YouTube, bus backs, movie theaters, and radio. SCVURPPP funding was used for bus back advertisements. The SCVURPPP Scripts Review Work Group provided input for developing the advertisements. The advertisements, which featured Sharks player William Eklund and the message "Put trash in the bin for the win," received over 4 million impressions and led to an increase in visits to the Watershed Watch website. The MC thanked Ivan for his presentation and recommended exploring partnerships with other sports teams to help reach different audiences.

2. FY 2025-26 Annual Report Guidance

Vishakha Atre (Program staff) reported that the FY 2025-26 Annual Report Guidance memorandum was sent to the MC on May 13, 2026. She provided an overview of the schedule for submitting draft and final Co-permittee Annual Reports and other deliverables. The guidance memo, attachments, and annual report forms with SCVURPPP-specific guidance are posted on the MC SharePoint page.

The MC discussed the Provision C.5.f.ii(2) requirement to develop a plan and schedule for updating each Permittee's MS4 information. The plan is due with the FY 25-26 Annual Report. Program staff have developed a template for preparing the plan and it is available on the IND/IDDE SharePoint site. Sheila Tucker (WVSWA) offered to share the MS4 plan developed by the City of Campbell.

B. PROGRAM BUDGET AND WORK PLAN

No items.

C. PROGRAM MANAGER'S REPORT

1. BAMS Collaborative Update

Chris provided the following updates:

- The external BAMSC Steering Committee meeting scheduled for next Thursday was rescheduled to June 5 from 9-11 AM. The internal meeting will be held on May 28.
- WB staff have been working with PG&E on their efforts to remove PCBs-containing oils from their electrical infrastructure. A presentation will be made at a future BAMSC meeting by PG&E to provide an update on their efforts.

2. CASQA Update

Chris provided the following updates

- The 2026 CASQA conference will be held in Sacramento from October 26-28, 2026.
- Carmel Brown (Assistant Executive Director, CASQA) is retiring soon. CASQA will be posting a job announcement to fill her position in the near future.
- Program staff are preparing an application to nominate SCVURPPP for the CASQA Outstanding Stormwater BMP Implementation Project or Program award. The application will cover tasks completed collectively over the last 15

years to achieve the MRP 100% trash load reduction benchmark and significantly reduce levels of trash in local surface waters from stormwater.

3. Grants Update

The following updates were provided:

- Concept Proposals for the Urban Greening Grants are due on June 4, 2026. This grant will fund development projects that use nature-based solutions to mitigate the urban heat island effect, rising temperatures, and extreme heat impacts in urban areas. Green stormwater infrastructure projects are eligible to receive funding.
- The San Mateo County C/CAG was selected to receive an EPA San Francisco Bay Program grant for PCB monitoring and risk abatement.
- The City of San José was also selected to receive an EPA San Francisco Bay Program grant for developing an alternative compliance program.

4. Legislative Update

Not discussed.

VIII. MRP IMPLEMENTATION

A. NEW DEVELOPMENT AND REDEVELOPMENT

Jill reported that the C3PO AHTG met on May 18 and reviewed the FY 26-27 GSI Work Plan and MRP 4.0 schedule, process, and topics.

B. TRASH CONTROLS AND UNSHELTERED HOMELESS

Chris provided the following updates:

- All OVTAs for FY 25-26 will be completed in June and the updated trash dashboard will be available in early July.
- Permittees do not need to submit updates to Section C.17 of the FY 24-25 Annual Reports at this time. WB staff are discussing comments internally and will meet with BAMSC representatives in June to discuss next steps.

C. MONITORING / POLLUTANTS OF CONCERN

Chris reported that the LID Monitoring, trash outfall monitoring, and trash receiving water monitoring for Water Year 2026 are complete. Brian T. Jones (Mountain View) reported that the trash outfall location in Mountain View is being discontinued. Program staff are looking for an alternate location to begin monitoring in fall/winter 2026.

D. OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

The Watershed Watch “Cleanup and Connect” event held on May 16, 2026 as part of National River Cleanup Day was well attended and participants enjoyed the educational activities. A Watershed Watch 50% off car wash event will be held on May 28, 2026.

E. OTHER PERMIT-RELATED ACTIVITIES

The following updates were provided:

- The BAMSC Cost Reporting Work Group meeting will be held on May 28, 2026.

- The SCVURPPP Information Management Needs Assessment survey is being finalized per comments received. The final survey will be distributed in early June.
- The next Information Management AHTG meeting will be held on June 4, 2026.

F. MRP Reissuance

Chris reported that the four high-priority MRP 4.0 work groups (Trash, Monitoring, PCBs and Mercury, and C.3) have started meeting. The moderate priority work groups will start meeting in June or July. The work groups will stop meeting in September 2026. The administrative draft of MRP 4.0 is expected in November or early December, with public workshops in February 2027. The Permit will likely be adopted in Fall 2027.

The first closed session with SCVURPPP outside Counsel to discuss the MRP reissuance related litigation will be held as part of the June meeting.

IX. OTHER BUSINESS

Not discussed.

SUBJECT: Management Committee (MC) Briefing on Priority Items

Program Management

- * Program-SFEI Data Sharing Agreement – The San Francisco Estuary Institute (SFEI) began the *Healthy Watersheds and Thriving Cities* project in 2024. The project brings together local agencies, community-based organizations, Tribes, and community members to assist with the identification of areas that could most benefit from urban greening projects in the Santa Clara Valley. The project includes over 17 partner organizations (including SCVURPPP) and focuses on a community-led approach to planning and implementing nature-based greening solutions in the Guadalupe and Coyote Creek watersheds. At the direction of the MC, SCVURPPP staff provided geospatial data to SFEI in 2025 that was publicly available on the Program’s stormwater treatment measure data portal. EOA (as the Program Manager) entered into a data sharing agreement with SFEI prior to sharing the geospatial data. SFEI has recently requested additional geospatial data included with the Program’s 2019 Stormwater Resource Plan, which broadly identifies high priority areas throughout the region where green stormwater infrastructure (GSI) should be considered. The data would be used to support the *Healthy Watersheds and Thriving Cities* project and another SFEI project focused on sediment supply to SF Bay. Program staff have drafted a second data sharing agreement and will request direction from the MC on the proposed sharing of these data with SFEI at the June 18th MC meeting.
- * FY 2025-26 Annual Report Guidance - Guidance on preparation of the FY 2025-26 Annual Report has been prepared by Program staff and was emailed to the MC on May 13th. All Annual Report forms have been finalized and SCVURPPP-specific guidance has been added to the forms. The guidance and forms are available on the MC Share Drive (see the May 13th email for the link to the folder) and on the SCVURPPP members only webpage.

Note: * indicates that Program staff has identified this item for discussion and/or consideration for approval at the Management Committee meeting.

- MRP 4 Reissuance and Workgroups – Regional Water Board and Program/Permittee Workgroup participants began to meet in April 2026. High priority Workgroups include: C.3 (New/Redevelopment), C.8 (Water Quality Monitoring), C.10 (Trash), and C.11/12 (Mercury/PCBs). Moderate priority provisions include those not included as low or high priority. Workgroups for moderate priority provisions will begin meeting in the summer. Although SCVURPPP lead participants on the high and moderate priority Workgroups have been identified, all SCVURPPP Permittees can join the Workgroup meetings if they choose. Dates and times for the Workgroup meetings are included on the MC calendar included with the monthly information packet. Workgroup meeting agendas and materials will be posted on the MC SharePoint portal under the MRP 4.0 section (see link below). Updates on Workgroups and the broader reissuance process will also be provided via this briefing memo (see the end of the memo) and verbally during MC meetings (including closed sessions as needed) until the MRP is reissued in 2027.
- Internal SCVURPPP SharePoint Portals – The [Management Committee \(MC\) SharePoint portal](#) is the primary portal moving forward for MC representatives to access information regarding the MC. There are fifteen (15) additional SharePoint portals that Program staff have completed, creating improved access and management of Program-related information. The MC SharePoint portal is accessible by all MC members.

Legislative/Policy Update

- Second year applicable bills that will continue to be considered by the legislature and new stormwater-related bills are being tracked by both Program staff and CASQA. Additional information on the status of these bills will be provided by Program staff at the MC meeting.

Municipal Operations (C.2)

- Municipal Operations AHTG - There was an in-person workshop on Tuesday, June 2nd from 9:30am – 1:00pm at the Cypress Pavilion, Lake Cunningham Regional Park, 2305 S White Road, San José. Seventy-eight municipal staff attended the training that had eight field stations presenting equipment/BMPs for use in municipal maintenance stormwater pollution prevention activities.

New Development and Redevelopment (C.3)

- C3PO AHTG –The C3PO AHTG met on May 18th and reviewed the the FY 25-26 GSI Work Plan and received an update on the MRP 4 C.3 Work Group topics. The next meeting will be held on June 22, 2026.

Industrial/Commercial Business Inspection/Illicit Discharge Detection/Elimination (C.4/C.5)

- IND/IDDE AHTG - Program staff emailed the Spill Cleanup and Outdoor Storage fact sheet in the new SCVURPPP format to the AHTG for review. Comments were due June 11th.
- C.15.b.iii Emergency Firefighting Discharges – MRP Provision C.15.b.iii.(3)(a) requires Permittees to begin implementation of the recommendations included in the Regional Report once it is submitted and report on progress in Annual Reports. The BAMSC Firefighting Work Group met on May 4, 2026.

Construction Controls (C.6)

- Construction Inspection AHTG – Program staff are working with a consultant to have the construction BMP fact sheets translated and ADA compliant.
- CASQA Construction BMP Handbook Group Subscription List – Program staff compiled an updated CASQA Construction BMP Handbook group subscription list based on requested

updates from Co-permittees. Program staff are working on updating the list on the CASQA website.

Watershed Education and Outreach (C.7)

- Watershed Watch Campaign – Watershed Watch hosted a Cleanup and Connect Event as part of National River Cleanup Day on Saturday, May 16, 2026, at Gill Memorial Park in Milpitas. A total of 25 volunteers attended the event and collected 21.7 pounds of trash.
- Outreach Events - The Watershed Watch booth was at two events in April, City of Santa Clara's Earth Day and Arbor Day (April 2) and the City of Milpitas's Earth Day Celebration (April 18). A Watershed Watch 50% off car wash event was held at Pacific Hand Car Wash (San José) on Tuesday, June 9, 2026. The event was previously scheduled for May 28, 2026, but cancelled due to rain.
- Land Use Subgroup/PSBWF – The Peninsula South Bay Watershed Forum and SCVURPPP hosted the Summer Forum event on Monday, June 1, 2026, with a focus on the Coyote Valley watershed. Entitled “Discovering Coyote Valley: Water, Wildlife & Plan for a Resilient Future”, the event drew an audience of 30 participants and included the following three presentations:
 - “Introduction to Coyote Valley and the Coyote Valley Conservation Areas Mater Plan” by Jennifer Peth, Senior Open Space Planner at the Santa Clara Valley Open Space Authority;
 - “Hydrology and Watershed Restoration in Coyote Valley” by Rachel Clemons, Watershed Restoration Specialist at the Santa Clara Valley Open Space Authority; and
 - “Wildlife Habitat and Connectivity in Coyote Valley” by Taylor Jang, Senior Land Manager at the Peninsula Open Space Trust.

The next Forum event is planned for Winter 2026/27. If you have a suggestion for a topic, please email Peter Schultze-Allen, Program staff. A video recording of the event will be posted on-line. SCVURPPP is currently in the process of copying the videos of past Forum events from the GrassRoots Ecology channel on [Youtube](#) to a new page on the Watershed Watch website.

Monitoring (C.8)

- Low Impact Development (LID) Monitoring – LID monitoring began at two locations in the City of San José (TCM4 and TCM6) in Water Year (WY) 2024 (i.e., October 2023 – September 2024) and continued through WY 2025 (i.e., through Sept 2025). Starting in WY 2026 (October 1, 2025), monitoring was modified to one location (TCM6) and monitoring has been discontinued at TCM4 because of unresolved issues at that site. Monitoring will continue at TCM6 during WY 2027 (i.e., October 2026 – September 2027). The next LID Monitoring Technical Advisory Group (TAG) meeting is currently planned for June 24th. Progress to date with LID monitoring will be discussed with TAG members. A full reporting of the LID monitoring conducted during WYs 2024 and WY 2025 was reported to the Water Board in the Integrated Monitoring Report (IMR) that was submitted to the Water Board on March 31, 2026. WY 2026 data will be reported with the Program's WY 2026 Urban Creeks Monitoring Report (UCMR) in March 2027.
- Trash Monitoring – Trash outfall monitoring began in WY 2024 at three sites in the Santa Clara Valley – Stevens, Coyote and San Francisquito creeks – and continued through WY 2026. Due to ongoing challenges with monitoring equipment at the Stevens creek site, this site is being discontinued starting in WY 2027. Program staff are currently trying to identify an alternative site for equipment deployment during WY 2027.

Trash receiving water monitoring began in WY 2025 and samples have been collected at two sites located in Santa Clara County during both WYs 2025 and 2026. WY 2026 monitoring ended in April 2026 and WY 2027 will begin in October 2026.

Trash monitoring is being conducted in coordination with the Trash Monitoring TAG, which last met on May 27th. The TAG provided input on a number of trash monitoring topics, including results to date for both outfall and receiving water monitoring. TAG meetings occur once per year during the term of MRP 3.0. The next meeting is scheduled for spring 2027.

- POCs Monitoring – Comprehensive reporting on all POC monitoring conducted during MRP 3.0 was reported to the Water Board in the IMR that was submitted on March 31, 2026. Planning and implementation of WY 2026 POCs monitoring is focused on the sites identified in the SCVURPPP Old Industrial Area Control Measure Plan and discussed with the POC AHTG. Planning for sediment sampling at sites across Santa Clara Valley is currently ongoing. Program staff collected sediment samples on-site at twelve old industrial properties in San José in early June and collected additional public right-of-way sediment samples during the remainder of the month. Program staff collected additional public ROW sediment samples in San José in October and December and will use the results to identify additional locations for on-site sampling later this year.
- Pesticide/Toxicity Monitoring – MRP 3.0 requires that the Program conduct wet weather and dry weather monitoring for pesticides and toxicity. SCVURPPP worked with BAMSC regional partners to successfully accomplish all wet and dry weather pesticides and toxicity monitoring requirements. Wet weather pesticide and toxicity monitoring is now complete for the permit term. All results are reported in the IMR, which was submitted to the Water Board on March 31, 2026.
- Monitoring AHTG Meetings - The Monitoring AHTG last met on March 4, 2026, to discuss the Draft IMR. The next meeting will be planned for this fall.

Trash Controls (C.10)

- On-land Visual Trash Assessments (OVTAs) – OVTAs for FY 2025-26 began in late September 2025 and will continue through June 2026. Updates on OVTA results are being provided to Co-permittees individually throughout the FY, including the risk of sites no longer demonstrating low trash generation.
- Long-term Trash Reduction Guidance – Program staff continue to complete subtasks as part of the Long-term Trash Reduction Guidance tasks in FY 2025-26, including revisions to baseline trash generation maps, updating ArcGIS Online (AGOL) trash generation maps, trash dashboard updates and maintenance, continued assistance with the private land drainage area (PLDA) trash control program, assistance in siting small (catch basin insert) types of full capture systems, and support for Co-permittees maintaining the MRP mandated 100% trash load reduction benchmark. All Co-permittees demonstrated the achievement of the 100% trash load reduction benchmark in FY 2025-26.
- Private Land Area Drainage Area (PLDA) Inspections – Program staff have identified all PLDAs that need to be inspected by Co-permittees, consistent with the MRP. The inventory is included in the trash dashboard. Co-permittees have provided Program staff with the results of their PLDA inspections, which have been incorporated into the dashboard to assist with calculating trash load reductions.
- Bioretention as Full Trash Capture (FTC) Systems – During FY 2025-26, Program staff will work with Water Board staff to come up with an acceptable method towards ensuring that qualifying bioretention systems are full trash capture systems. The goal of this process is to reach agreement on the criteria that need to be met to count a bioretention system as full trash capture and include these criteria in MRP 4.0.

- Trash AHTG Meetings – The Trash AHTG typically meets on the 3rd Tuesday of the month. The next meeting is scheduled for June 16th.
- Zero Litter Initiative (ZLI) – The ZLI Steering Committee meets approximately monthly via Zoom. The ZLI last met on April 3, 2026. Please send topics for future ZLI meetings to Program staff. The May and June meetings were canceled. The next meeting of the ZLI is scheduled for Friday, July 10, 2026 (rescheduled to avoid the July 4th holiday) via Zoom.

Pollutants of Concern Controls (C.11/C.12)

- PCB/Hg Source Property/Area Identification Studies- Program staff are continuing to work with individual Co-permittees to plan and implement source investigations during FY 2025-26, consistent with the plans described in the Final-Revised Old Industrial Area Control Measure Plan (OICMP) that was submitted to the Regional Water Board in September 2024. Recent efforts have identified two properties in the City of San José that had sediment samples with moderate PCBs concentrations and two properties in the City of San José that had high PCBs concentrations. Program staff held meetings and are currently planning follow-up meetings with City of San José staff to discuss next steps for these properties. Program staff are currently reviewing the analytical data from the Fall 2025 sampling and have begun planning for additional private property on-site inspections and sampling for later this summer. Program staff will schedule meetings with the applicable Co-permittees to discuss next steps.
- Mercury and PCBs TMDL Implementation Plan and Reasonable Assurance Analysis (RAA Plan) – Co-permittees are required to submit an updated RAA Plan to the Water Board by March 31, 2026. Program staff developed a work plan for these updates, and the POC AHTG reviewed and approved the workplan in March and April 2025. The updated RAA Plan will entail updated GSI modeling and updated source control implementation to determine when the TMDL wasteload allocations for Santa Clara Valley can be achieved. Program staff began implementing the workplan in April 2025, starting with requests for data from Co-permittees on GSI projects completed and other stormwater controls that have been implemented or planned during MRP 3. Program staff continued to gather additional information from Co-permittees as needed and prepared a draft RAA Plan, which was sent to the AHTG on January 7, 2026 and discussed at the January 12th POC AHTG meeting. The Final Updated RAA Plan was approved by the MC at their March meeting and submitted to the Water Board on March 31, 2026.
- SF Bay Regional Monitoring Program (RMP) – Program staff serves as stormwater representatives on the RMP’s Steering Committee (SC) and Technical Review Committee (TRC). Program staff participate to ensure, to the extent possible, that information needs and priority projects for the RMP align with monitoring needs and requirements identified in the regional stormwater permit. The TRC meets in June and the Steering Committee next meets in July. In addition, Program staff serve as stormwater representatives on various RMP workgroups, including the Sources Pathways and Loadings Work Group (SPLWG), the PCBs Work Group, and the Emerging Contaminants Work Group (ECWG).
- Tracking POC Control Measure Implementation – The Program’s Stormwater Treatment Measures Data Portal is available to the public at <https://scvurppp.org/gsi/>. Additional functionality will be added to the database in FY 2025-26 to align with MRP 3.0 Asset Management requirements.
- Pollutants of Concern AHTG Meetings - The POC AHTG last met on May 29, 2026. The main agenda item was the implementation of the PCBs Control Program during Building Demolition. The next POC AHTG meeting is scheduled for this fall.

Water Utility (C.15)

- Water Utility AHTG – No updates.

Unsheltered Homeless Populations (C.17)

- RV Discharges – As discussed at the Unsheltered Homeless Populations AHTG meeting and the MC meeting, Program staff researched how agencies are addressing sanitary waste discharges from RVs and developed two memoranda. The first memorandum summarizes practices being implemented by three SCVURPPP Co-permittees to address RV discharges and includes information from Seattle, Washington and Portland, Oregon. The second memorandum provides an analysis of options for Co-permittee implementation of a mobile RV sanitary discharge pump out program in the Santa Clara Valley and the potential assistance that Program staff could provide to support Co-permittee efforts. Both memoranda were distributed to the MC for review on April 22, 2026 with comments due on May 12, 2026. Minor comments were received from the City of Mountain View. A MC follow-up meeting is currently being scheduled to discuss the memos and next steps.

Cost Reporting (C.20)

- Cost Reporting Work Group - A Cost Reporting Work Group meeting was held on October 28th to discuss the cost report preparation process and lessons learned. Participants provided helpful feedback on the challenges of cost estimating and suggestions for minor modification to the Cost Reporting Framework. This input will be shared with regional partners as part of the BAMSC regional project to update the Bay Area Framework starting in April. The FY 2025-26 version of the Cost Reporting Framework (updated with SCVURPPP budgets) was prepared and distributed to Co-permittees on April 15th. The next SCVURPPP Cost Reporting Work Group will be scheduled for June.

Information/Asset Management (C.21)

- Information Management AHTG – The AHTG meets monthly to assist Co-permittees with development and implementation of Asset Management Plans and to discuss broader information management efforts within SCVURPPP. An Information Management AHTG meeting was held on January 12th. Risk analysis strategy and an approach for management of pervious pavement assets were discussed. Condition assessment trainings for GSI assets were held on December 18th and January 8th. The last meeting occurred on June 4th. The next meeting is scheduled for July 2nd.
- Internal MS SharePoint Pages - Program staff have developed Microsoft SharePoint pages for the Management Committee and each of the AHTGs. The SharePoint pages provide member agency staff with access to key information, documents, dashboards, and calendars pertinent to each group.
- Information Management Needs Assessment – On behalf of Co-permittees, the Program collects and manages many different types of data, including those associated with water quality monitoring, trash control measures, PCBs source property investigations, Private Land Drainage Areas (PLDAs), On-land Visual Trash Assessments (OVTAs), and Green Stormwater Infrastructure (GSI). These data are collected using a variety of technologies, none of which are currently standardized. Additionally, these data are currently stored in topic-specific data management systems that have been developed over many years using different technologies and platforms. In addition to data collected by the Program, Co-permittees also collect data for MRP compliance. Data are collected using varying approaches and technologies. Conceptually, resources currently used individually by Co-permittees on data collection, storage, management and utilization could be centralized into standardized platforms and technologies that would provide the easier sharing of data amongst Co-permittees and

compilation of data at the Program-scale. However, there are clear reasons why data are collected and stored by individual Co-permittees using their own technologies and platforms. To evaluate the evolving information management needs of the Program and Co-permittees and recommend approaches that may improve data standardization, reporting efficiencies, and access to support decision-making, the MC requested that the Program conduct an information management needs assessment.

As a first step in conducting the needs assessment, a survey was distributed to Co-permittees in early June and reviewed with the Information Management AHTG at their June meeting. Survey responses are due to Program staff at the end of June. Once the survey is completed, Program staff will follow up individually with Co-permittees to further discuss information management and help inform recommended steps, priorities, tasks and timelines for FY 2026-27. The goal is to finalize a multi-year work plan for Program information management prior to FY 2027-28 Work Plan and budget discussions, which begin in November 2027.

- SCVURPPP Website – The SCVURPPP website was updated to address ADA compliance. Consistent with the Program’s Work Plan, the SCVURPPP website (www.scvurppp.org) will be fully updated later this calendar year. The website will be redesigned and essential information available to the public will be included. A draft/beta version of the website will be shared with the Information Management AHTG in late summer or early fall 2026.



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Highlights of Bay Area Municipal Stormwater Collaborative (BAMSC) Steering Committee, Subcommittee and Work Group Meetings May-June 2026

Steering Committee – May 28 (Internal) and June 5 (External)

Co-Chairs – Sandy Mathews (ACCWP) and Chris Sommers (SCVURPPP)

SCVURPPP representatives – Jill Bicknell, Bonnie de Berry, and Jeff Sinclair (Program staff)

Internal Meeting

- June Presentation to the Regional Water Board on PCBs – The Committee discussed the planned presentation by Lisa Sabin (EOA) on behalf of all Phase I MRP Permittees and Programs. Rob Carson has agreed to present on behalf of Phase II Permittees. Both presentations will describe the work conducted to date, the resources expended, and the challenges with meeting the 20-year PCBs TMDL timeline.
- PCBs TMDL Special Studies Project Update – Implementation of project work plans by countywide programs is underway. Programs are continuing to track match contributions. Funding under the grant is being used to supplement PCBs monitoring needed to identify source properties. Additionally, funding is being used to establish one fixed monitoring station over the course of the next three years in each of the four main MRP counties (Alameda, Contra Costa, Santa Clara and San Mateo). The first station is being established in Alameda and will be operational in the fall/winter 2026. The other stations will go online in 2027 and 2028. Station locations are being identified in coordination with the RMP and Water Board staff.
- Watching Our Watersheds (WOW) Project
 - *OVTA Data Analysis* – The data analysis of OVTAs for frequency, density of sites, and seasonality trends, and a framework for adaptive management in MRP has been completed and a draft report was distributed to MRP Permittees for review. Based on the extent of the comments received by Permittees/Programs, a separate meeting may be necessary to discuss reconciliation of the comments. Once comments have been addressed, a revised draft report will be provided to Regional Water Board staff for comment, prior to finalizing and submitting it to EPA.
 - *Trash Receiving Water Monitoring* – Monitoring at the six regional sites is complete for WY 2026. Methods that will be used to calculate annual loads were presented to the Trash Monitoring TAG at their May 27, 2026 meeting.
- MRP 4 Reissuance
 - The Steering Committee spent a significant portion of the meeting discussing the status and progress of the MRP 4 Workgroups. Additional information on the status of the workgroups can be found on the BAMSC Google Drive.

External Meeting

- Update on Regional Work Groups (these are now part of the External Meeting)
 - Firefighting Discharges Work Group –The Final BMP Report was submitted with the Program’s Annual Report by September 30th. The BAMSC Firefighting Work Group’s annual meeting was held on May 4, 2026. WB staff attended and provided an overview of their perspective on the BMP Report. A copy of their presentation will be distributed. There will not be a formal (written) Water Board response to the BMP Report.
 - Climate Change Adaptation Report (CCAR) Work Group – The Work Group met on May 7th to review the draft CCAR and provide comments. The Project Team revised the draft based on these comments and distributed the revised report to the Countywide Programs for Permittee review and comment by June 10th.
 - BASMAA Surface Cleaning Program – The Work Group met to review materials and discuss what to update and what to discontinue. They will send their recommendations to BAMSC. The updates will begin next FY.
 - Long-Term GSI Technical Working Group (TWG) –The TWG held its third meeting of FY 2025-26 on June 4, 2026. The meeting continued the discussion of two elements of the recommended framework for achieving GSI numeric targets in MRP 4: project types and credits for multiple benefit, and Permittees presented a proposed approach to crediting project stages (including O&M). Next steps are to present the proposed GSI framework to the C.3 Work Group where conversations related to MRP 4 will continue.
 - Cost Reporting Work Group – This group reconvened on May 28th to oversee the project of regional benefit to revise the Bay Area Cost Reporting Framework to allow Bay Area permittees to report costs to the State’s Cost Data Portal in FY 2026-27. The Work Group approved the work plan for changes to the Framework and work is underway. A meeting is being set up with Joseph Monical, Water Board staff, to get feedback on the current Framework Tool and Guidance and begin planning for C.20 Work Group meeting(s).
 - Trees in GSI Work Group – This Work Group meets twice per year via Zoom. The group last met on December 17, 2025. The next meeting of the Work Group is TBD; however, as a result of Long Term GSI TWG discussions, WB staff have asked to meet with a small group of Permittees about example of how urban forestry projects could qualify for GSI numeric retrofit credit.
- Regional Water Board Collaboration (Rebecca Nordenholt and other staff)
 - MRP 4 Work Groups – WB staff reported out on the C.3, C.8, and C.10 Work Group initial meetings. For Medium Priority Provisions (C.15, C.17, and C.21), it was agreed that WB feedback on submittals should occur in advance of Workgroup meetings. Rebecca reported that Jacob Fine-Thomas (WB staff) is reviewing the regional C.17 BMP report and plans to set up a meeting with Program Managers soon. Mel Johnson (WB staff) has completed reviews of Asset Management Plans and will share comments with BAMSC Managers following internal discussions of findings. Joe Monical (WB staff) will work with BAMSC representatives to set up a C.20 Workgroup meeting in August.
 - Long Term GSI TWG – WB staff agreed that the June 4th LTGIS TWG meeting was productive. WB staff would like to meet with BAMSC representatives to coordinate the transition to the C.3 Workgroup.
 - Report of Waste Discharge (ROWD) and MRP 4 Schedule – Rebecca Nordenholdt (WB staff) will send out to BAMSC Managers WB staff perspectives on the ROWD and (in a separate email) an updated MRP 4 schedule.
 - Monitoring Costs Discussion – The increased costs of monitoring between MRP 3 and 4 was briefly discussed and BAMSC Managers emphasized that BAMSC representatives to

the MRP 4 C.8 Workgroup have identified key areas where efficiencies could be realized in MRP 4.

- Phase II Permit – WB staff indicated that State Water Board staff are expecting to release the first public draft of the Phase II statewide NPDES permit on July 2. There will be a 60-day comment period. BAMSC will be coordinating with CASQA to provide comments to State Water Board staff.
- WB Meetings – Rebecca reported on the May 13th WB meeting that consisted of a field visit to GSI facilities in Mission Bay (SF). The purpose was to educate WB members on the types, benefits, and challenges of these infrastructure projects. A PCBs TMDL update will be provided at the WB's June 10th meeting. BAMSC is coordinating a presentation via the MPC for that item.

Announcements

The following announcements were made:

- The County of Santa Clara Office of Sustainability and Resilience is hosting a virtual training titled *Nature-Based Solutions Training: Catalyzing Communities for Climate Action & Regional Resilience Through Regenerative Practices* on May 18, 2026.
- Concept proposals for the 2026 Urban Greening Grant Program are due on June 4, 2026. The grant will fund projects that use nature-based solutions to mitigate climate change impacts such as the urban heat island effect, rising temperatures, and extreme heat. GSI projects are eligible to receive grant funding. Additional information is available at <https://resources.ca.gov/grants/urban-greening>.

FY 25-26 Annual Report Form C.3 Section

Vishakha Atre (SCVURPPP) reported that the FY 2025-26 Annual Report Form C.3 Section with SCVURPPP-specific guidance was sent to the Management Committee last week. There are two new C.3 reporting requirements, Provision C.3.j.v.(2) which requires Permittees to describe the implementation of their GSI plans and Provision C.3.j.v.(4), which requires Permittees to describe lessons learned and challenges in implementing GSI plans. Program staff will provide memos with guidance and example text for reporting on these requirements in early June.

FY 26-27 GSI Work Plan

Jill Bicknell (SCVURPPP) presented the FY 26-27 GSI Work Plan, outlining key tasks and budget allocations. The GSI Work Plan budget was approved as part of the overall SCVURPPP FY 26-27 budget. Jill noted that budget allocated to the tasks can be changed, as long as the overall budget remains the same. Attendees did not recommend any changes to the Work Plan. Highlights of the items discussed are below:

- Pam Boyle Rodriguez (Palo Alto) asked about the timeline for updating the Biotreatment Soil Media (BSM) specifications. Jill responded that a regional update effort will likely be required in MRP 4. Updates to the specification require approval from the Water Board Executive Officer. Peter Schultze-Allen (SCVURPPP) added that the alternative specifications portion of the current BSM specification allow for custom blends if they meet the requirements.
- Sheila Tucker (WVSA) asked if all FY 25-26 GIS Work Plan tasks are on schedule to be completed. Jill replied that all tasks will be completed in June.
- Julie Schaer (WVSA) asked if any SCVURPPP Co-permittees are working with schools to implement GSI projects. Some AHTG members noted that it is difficult to coordinate with public schools as they are not within local agency jurisdiction.

MRP 4.0 Update

Jill provided the following updates:

- The MRP 4 C.3 Work Group has started meeting. The Work Group will meet every other month, starting in May 2026. Based on discussions held so far, the threshold for Regulated Projects will likely not change. The GSI numeric targets may increase but more flexibility in project types and crediting is likely. Water Board (WB) staff are planning to rewrite some sub-provisions to make expectations clearer. Permittees are requesting the following items:
 - Continuation of Special Project allowances;

- More flexibility in compliance with treatment of frontage improvements associated with Regulated Projects;
- Continuation of allowing road reconstruction projects to count toward GSI targets;
- Some mechanism to allow carryover of excess impervious acres treated from GSI projects constructed during MRP 3; and
- Allowing GSI numeric credit for a wider variety of project types, as part of a framework being proposed by the Long Term GSI Technical Working Group.:

Jill asked attendees to send real project examples related to "temporary projects" and frontage improvements, especially those involving small frontage areas or ADA improvements, to support discussions.

- The Long-Term GSI Technical Working Group (TWG) will meet on June 4, 2026. WB staff have not yet provided comments on the Permittee proposals presented at the March 25th TWG meeting. Several attendees recommended that BAMSC representatives should reach out to WB staff about the pending responses on multiple work products including the Firefighting BMPs Report, the Unsheltered Homeless BMP Report, and asset management plans.

Action Items:

- Program staff will prepare and distribute guidance memos on Provision C.3.j reporting requirements.
- Program staff will post Jill’s presentation on MRP 4 to the C3PO AHTG SharePoint page.
- Co-permittees should collect and send real project examples related to "temporary projects" and frontage improvements, especially those involving small frontage areas or ADA improvements, to support MRP 4 discussions.
- Program staff will send an email to Rebecca Nordenholt (WB staff) requesting feedback on the Long Term GSI TWG proposals for the GSI numeric retrofit credit framework.
- Program staff will work with BAMSC to follow-up with WB staff on approval of reports submitted so far in MRP 3.
